



As part of Carnival Corporation's broader environmental initiatives, and stewardship program 'Ocean's Alive', Carnival UK has a firm commitment to eliminating all non - essential single use items, and reducing single-use plastic on-board all P&O Cruises and Cunard ships.

Carnival UK has already removed non-essential Guest facing single use items including:

- balloons
- sail away flags
- party poppers and blowers
- party dressing up accessories such as hats and Hawaiian leis
- q-tips

And has replaced other wasteful single use items such as:

- straws
- cocktail and hot drink stirrers
- tooth picks
- take away cups and lids
- cutlery
- sugar and sweetener sachets
- sauce sachets
- individual serving containers for yoghurts, jams, honey, butter and spread

with more sustainable alternatives. For example sauces are now served from bulk pump containers and portions of honey, jam, butter and spread are served in individual reusable ceramic dishes.

One of our most urgent challenges was to ensure that plastic does not enter our food waste system. Carnival UK has set up a task force to monitor compliance, through crew training, and a thorough review of all types of plastic which could slip through. For example from the bristles of brushes used to clean galleys, to cling film. Switching to alternative brush heads which are also less likely to release bristles, and to blue cling film which can be more easily identified and therefore removed in advance.

However as part of our commitment, Carnival UK is currently working to reduce and where possible eliminate the use of cling film, and other single use plastic items such as:

- water bottles
- bin liners
- individual amenity bottles

and has made significant progress with this, trialing solutions before lock down and preparing to implement switches for our redeployment. For example moving to reusable, glass and aluminium water vessels and refillable larger shower gels and shampoos.
